\*\*Central Valley moved to a 3-year levy cycle in March 2000. In November 1997, Washington voters approved a measure allowing school districts to place 3 and 4-year levies on the ballot (previously allowed only 1 and 2-year levies).

*Note:* According to Spokane County Elections records, Central Valley School District voters have approved every Maintenance and Operations levy since the early 1970s (M&O levy failed in 1972).
