

High School Summer Credit Courses

Grades 9-12

A variety of academic opportunities are available to high school students who need to make up credits, want to get a jump start on their classes for fall 2009 or simply enjoy learning! Students may register for one or two classes. Review the choices available and register early. All classes will be offered subject to sufficient enrollment. A student is eligible for enrollment upon completion of the registration form and payment of tuition. Please review the Attendance Policy (in box below), prior to registration.

Students successfully completing an academic high school class during Summer School will receive ½ credit. The Summer School office will send credit/grade information to the student's school listed on the registration form. For graduation requirements, please contact your high school counselor.

Attendance Policy for High School Academic Classes

Credit is awarded for high school academic classes (grades 9-12) with appropriate attendance. According to Washington State law, 75 contact hours are required for a ½ credit course. This means the student may be absent from Summer School only once and late no more than twice. The absence or tardies must be made up through independent study. Please take these requirements into consideration before signing up for a class. Flexibility in these areas is extremely limited. High school (grades 9-12) students exceeding one absence and two tardies will lose credit and forfeit tuition.
